

Carlisle Borough Recycles

Welcome to Carlisle Borough's Solid Waste and Recycling Program. This program, commonly called, "pay as you throw" is designed to reduce waste and encourage recycling. Citizens *recycle free of charge and pay for only the trash they generate.*

Carlisle Borough residents who live in apartments with three units or less or who live in single or two-family dwellings must dispose of their trash in specific trash bags designated by the Borough. Owners of multi-family dwellings of more than three units must contract with a commercial hauler. Borough trash bags can be obtained at Borough Hall, 53 W. South Street, or at various retail establishments throughout the Borough. The cost of a Borough trash bag is set by Borough Council annually. Recyclable material is collected free of charge and must be placed at the curb for collection in a separate recycling container.

Curbside trash and recycling collection is provided once a week (Please contact the Borough for the day of collection in your area). When filled and set out for collection, garbage bags must weigh no more than 40 pounds, be tied or closed at the top and accessible to and not more than 2 feet from the side or curb of the street or alley from which collection is made. Trash and recyclable material may not be placed at the curb more than 24 hours prior to the time established for collection. A complete list of recyclable items is included in this brochure.

Carlisle's solid waste and recycling services include a bulk item collection and composting

Starting in January, 2009, one bulk item per week will be collected curb side for each resident who participates in the pay-as-you-throw program. A list of items acceptable for bulk collection are available on the Borough's website. These items must be placed at the curb on your designated collection day along with your garbage and recyclables.

For those items not covered in the Borough's bulk item collection, Cumberland County offers several annual programs for recycling computers and electronics, hazardous materials, appliances and tires, yard waste, telephone books, printer cartridges, rechargeable and cell phone battery and others. 
In addition to collecting leaves at the Borough's Compost Facility, leaves are collected curb side weekly for approximately six weeks in the fall. Holiday trees are collected for two weeks in January. Brush is collected curbside in the spring and fall. Look seasonally for more information on these collection programs in the *Carlisle Gazette* and on the Borough's web site.

Borough of Carlisle Compost Facility

Did you know that the Borough of Carlisle operates a compost facility located on Post Road? This facility allows Borough residents to drop off leaves and brush throughout the year. This material is composted and ground up to create mulch for Borough residents to use in their flowerbeds, gardens, etc.



Compost Facility Hours of Operation:

Beginning March 30 and continuing through September 3, 2016 the Compost Facility will be open on Wednesdays from 12 p.m. to 8 p.m. and Thursdays and Saturdays from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

THE FOLLOWING ARE ELIGIBLE RECYCLING MATERIALS AND SHOULD BE PLACED DEBRIS-FREE IN A SEPARATE RECYCLING CONTAINER FOR COLLECTION

GLASS: Clear & colored glass jars & bottles used to package most food, beverages & household items (rinsed, lids removed & debris-free) *Note: Broken glass not acceptable..*

PAPER: Newspapers (not bound or in plastic bags), glossy inserts, paper bags, mail, junk mail, magazines, telephone books, printer, copier and computer paper, construction paper, Kraft paper, cereal boxes, shoe boxes or similar.



CANS: Aluminum, bi-metallic, tin & steel including beverage, aerosol & food cans (rinsed & debris-free)

PLASTIC: Items with the numbers 1,2,3,4,5,6,7 Typically includes clear plastic soda bottles, milk & water jugs, detergent bottles, shampoo bottles, bleach bottles. Lids and food debris must be removed.

CARDBOARD: Plain corrugated cardboard with ribs. (must be tied/bundled; no larger than 2' x 2' or small enough to fit into your recycle bin.



NON-RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

THE FOLLOWING ARE NOT ELIGIBLE RECYCLING MATERIALS WHICH MUST BE PLACED IN BOROUGH TRASH BAGS FOR COLLECTION

GLASS: Broken glass, light bulbs, windows, auto glass, ceramic dishes, Pyrex, china, mirrors, cookware & drinking glasses (carefully contain broken items & place in Borough trash bags).

PAPER: Waxed milk/juice cartons, facial tissue, soiled napkins, paper plates & cups (place in Borough trash bags).

CANS: Paint or oil (allow to dry out then place in Borough trash bags). *Only latex paint cans may be placed in Borough trash bags if allowed to dry out completely.*

PLASTIC: Lids, plastic bags & all other items not bearing numbers 1 or 2 or marked PET, PETE, or HDPE (place in Borough trash bags). Examples include: coffee cups, meat trays, lids or caps, & egg cartons. *Plastic bags cannot be recycled under the Borough's Recycling Program.*

CARDBOARD: Pizza, soda, beer or any cardboard contaminated by food, (items may be torn into small pieces and placed in Borough trash bags)

METAL: Foil, coat hangers, cookware/bakeware & drink mix containers (place in Borough trash bags). Hydro needles (carefully dispose by placing in container and Borough trash bag).
