This collaborative Town Hall Meeting will be held in the gymnasium of YWCA Carlisle beginning at 6 pm with refreshments. Join the conversation!**

"Carlisle has the unique ability to impose a real-life experience on the community as a whole through the My Brother's Keeper Challenge," said Carlisle Mayor Tim Scott. "We are answering the call put forth by President Obama to help every youth in our society have the same opportunities and advantages no matter the circumstances we were each born into," Scott concluded. Work between the Mayor's office and community partners (including businesses, school districts and service agencies) have taken place over the course of the past year and plans are steadily progressing and moving forward at this time.
